OPEN SESSION OF MEETING ON APRIL 10, 2021

The Board of Governors for Truman State University met on Saturday, April 10, 2021, on the University campus in Kirksville, Missouri. The meeting was held in Georgian Rooms A and B in the Student Union Building. The open session of the meeting was called to order shortly after 1:00 p.m. by the Chair of the Board, K. Brooks Miller, Jr.

Participating in the meeting were six of the seven voting members: Sarah Burkemper, Philip J. Christofferson, Cheryl J. Cozette, Jennifer Kopp Dameron, Nancy Gingrich, and K. Brooks Miller, Jr. Governor Dameron participated via conference call. Jim O'Donnell, the seventh voting member, was unable to participate. His absence was recorded as excused.

Also participating were all three non-voting members: David Lee Bonner and Mike McClaskey, the two out-of-state members, and Abigail Smeltzer, student representative. Governors Bonner and McClaskey participated by conference call.

Call to Order and Chair Report

Governor Miller, Chair of the Board, called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

Minutes for Open Session of Meeting on February 6, 2021

Governor Burkemper moved the adoption of the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED that the minutes for the open session of the meeting on February 6, 2021, be approved.

The motion was seconded by Governor Cozette and carried by a unanimous vote of 6 to 0. Governor Miller declared the motion to be duly adopted.

Recognition of 2020 Board Chair – Jennifer Kopp Dameron

Given that Governor Dameron was not physically present at the April meeting, Governor Miller noted that she will be officially recognized in June for her service as the 2020 Board Chair.

President's Report

University President Susan L. Thomas shared a selected engagements report and provided information on several items of interest since the February Board Meeting. Within her report, she shared, among other topics, updates on University funding, transition of the Student Health Center and University Counseling Services to Complete Family Medicine, the most recent COVID vaccination event, and the tentative plans for Spring 2021 Commencement. President Thomas also reported on the work to identify key performance indicators for the 2021-2025 Strategic Plan.

Enrollment Management Report

Tyana Lange, Vice President for Enrollment Management and Marketing, provided an enrollment management report.

Faculty Senate Report

K. Scott Alberts, Faculty Senate President and Professor of Statistics, presented the annual Faculty Senate Report.

Academic and Student Affairs Committee Report

Governor Cozette, Chair of the Academic and Student Affairs Committee, provided a report on the committee meeting held earlier in the day.

Budget and Capital Projects Committee Report

Governor Gingrich, Chair of the Budget and Capital Projects Committee, provided a report on the committee meeting held earlier in the day.

Construction Projects Report

Governor Gingrich provided an update on construction projects which had been approved by the Board at previous meetings.

Contracts for Construction Projects and Equipment Purchases

Governor Gingrich reported that no construction project or equipment purchases totaling \$25,000 to \$100,000 had been approved since the last meeting of the Board.

Enrollments Fees

Governor Gingrich moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Truman State University's permitted increase for Missouri resident undergraduate full-time students for the 2021-22 academic year is 6.4% under the terms of the Higher Education Student Funding Act; and

WHEREAS, it is advisable to book this increase at this time;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Truman State University will apply this increase on the actual tuition rates for 2020-21 academic year under the terms of the Higher Education Student Funding Act and waive a portion of the additional increase at this time; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following enrollment fees for full-time students be approved, effective with the 2021 Fall Semester:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President is authorized to establish additional graduate pricing tiers for specialized and high-cost graduate programs to be competitive with other institutions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the designated fee for the Student Recreation Center included above be maintained at \$222 for each full-time equivalent student per academic year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the designated fee for the Student Union included above be increased to \$220 for each full-time equivalent student per academic year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following additional enrollment fees for students enrolled in 6 or more semester hours during the academic year be approved as follows:

- 1) A student activity fee of \$90 per academic year (\$45 per semester);
- 2) A student health fee of \$74 per academic year (\$37 per semester);
- 3) An athletic fee of \$116 per academic year (\$58 per semester);
- 4) An information/technology (itech) fee of \$34 per academic year (\$17 per semester); and
- 5) A sustainability fee of \$10 per academic year (\$5 per semester).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the freshman orientation fee remain at \$350 for freshman students during the fall semester, and a corresponding fee for freshman students participating in comparable orientation programs during other semesters, with each freshman student to pay such an orientation fee only a single time; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the University is authorized to charge tuition and fees for 2021-22 as outlined in Table 4 of the attachment; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the University is authorized to establish summer school rates designed to enhance enrollment in such programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the enrollment fees for part-time students, interim sessions, study abroad, professional development, specialized graduate programs, on-line programs, and the other enrollment fees, and miscellaneous charges not listed in this resolution, be established by the President of the University, based on the above fees and charges, in accordance with Section 11.010 and 11.020 of the Code of Policies; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of the background information and rationale for this fee proposal be attached to the minutes as an exhibit.

The motion was seconded by Governor Christofferson and carried by a unanimous vote of 6 to 0. Governor Miller declared the motion to be duly adopted, and the Secretary designated a copy of the document as Exhibit A.

Food Service Contractor

Governor Gingrich moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the current contract with Sodexo Food Services ends on May 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, it is advisable to extend this contract for two additional years, with the stipulation that the contract will be competitively bid at the conclusion of this period;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the President of the University is hereby authorized to negotiate an extension to the current Sodexo Food Services contract; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the University, or her designee, be authorized to sign a contract with Sodexo Food Services for a two-year period beginning May, 2022, and ending May, 2024.

The motion was seconded by Governor Cozette and carried by a unanimous vote of 6 to 0. Governor Miller declared the motion to be duly adopted.

Finance and Auditing Committee Report

Governor Burkemper, Chair of the Finance and Auditing Committee, provided a report on the committee meeting held on April 7.

Financial Report

Governor Burkemper presented the Financial Report which included a review as of February 28, 2021, of education and general revenues and expenditures and auxiliary system revenues and expenditures and a review as of February 28, 2021, of the Truman State University Foundation revenues and expenditures.

Background Information and Rationale for FY 2022 Enrollment Fee Proposal

For several years public institutions in Missouri have held tuition increases at or below the Consumer Price Index (CPI). This is due to the tuition cap statute as well as multiple agreements with the Executive and Legislative branches of government to cap tuition increases at a minimum. Tuition increases have been at or below 1% five times in the past decade. During that same period (FY 11 – FY 20) Truman's state appropriation declined by 15%. Actual state support for FY 2021 is roughly equal to FY 1999.

Several Missouri institutions with different tuition rates for traditional versus online programs have indicated that they plan to blend these into single rates and request a waiver on the tuition cap. Missouri State has already taken this action, and the new rate represents a 12.7% increase per credit hour. Northwest, Central, and Southeast also plan to request waivers for blended rates which will exceed the tuition cap for 2021-22.

Comparisons of total costs including mandatory fees are not available at this time, however Table 1 outlines typical tuition and fees by campus for 2020-21. Truman has maintained its relative position in this list for several years. Table 2 and 3 outline tuition and fees at Truman including the proposed "booked tuition" for 2021-22.

Proposed Actual Tuition Charged for 2021-22

As recommended in the agenda item, the subtotal for tuition, Student Union, and Recreation Center would be rolled back, putting Truman's increase in line with other institutions.

With the 2021-22 increase of 4.9% applied to 2020-21 charged amounts, the actual increase to full-time students would be \$390 for a Missouri undergraduate. Expressed as the cost per credit hour, the proposed increase is \$13 per credit hour for a Missouri undergraduate student. The total increase for a student living on-campus will be \$518 for the academic year. Actual costs for 2021-22 for undergraduate students are outlined in Table 4.
