

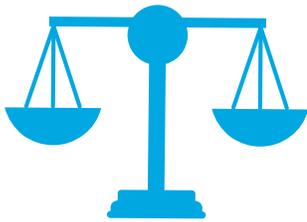
# BS Criminal Justice Studies
