ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university with an overall undergraduate grade point average of at least 2.75.
- Valid teaching certification or eligibility to meet initial teaching certification requirements.
- \$40 application fee waived for teachers.
- Personal Statement (uploaded in online application)
- Official copies of transcripts from all colleges and universities from which you earned college credit.

Note: Truman students do not need to upload their transcript but should list Truman in the academic history portion of their application.
