Some recent elective topics include dementia, head and neck cancer, medical SLP and autism

Education Component

- CMDS 621 G - Psychology of Reading Credits: 3
- This requirement must be met by all Communication Disorders Master's graduates from Truman. Normally, this requirement is met by completing ED 621G Psychology of Reading. However, students who can demonstrate mastery of this material through coursework completed at another university may, with the consent of their advisor, substitute these credits with electives.

Practicum Component

- CMDS 681 G - Advanced Clinical Practice Credits: 1-3 (must be taken at least 3 times)
- CMDS 682 G - Internship in Hospital/Clinic Credits: 4
- CMDS 683 G - Internship in Public School Credits: 4
- **Clinical Hours Requirement:** Students are required to complete a minimum of 400 clinical contact hours of which 325 must be completed at the graduate level. The curriculum is designed to qualify master's degree candidates for Missouri Licensure and the Certificate of Clinical Competence awarded by the American Speech-Language Hearing Association. Typically, CMDS 681G is taken every semester the student is on campus.

Clinical Process Commentaries

- CMDS 676 G - Clinical Process Commentary 1 Credits: 1-3
- CMDS 677 G - Clinical Process Commentary 2 Credits: 1-3

The Clinical Process Commentaries (CPC) consists of a sequence of major projects that:

- Emphasize strong ties between the academic and clinical curricula.
- Provide opportunity for formative and summative evaluation.
- Provide opportunity for students to demonstrate depth of knowledge and expertise through both oral and written presentation.

The CPC is required at two (2) different times in the course of graduate study, usually the second semester (spring) and the last semester (fall) prior to internship. A total of 3 credits of CPC is required.

Research Component

- CMDS 667 G - Research Methodology Credits: 3

All graduate students complete a single-subject research project with a client they are assigned in the clinic.

Thesis Option: 6 Credits

- CMDS 689G - Research in Communication Disorders (Thesis) Credit(s): 1-6
